




THE LORD'S PRAYER

THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE HOLY SACRAMENT

All baptized Christians are invited to receive Holy Communion, without regard to denominational affiliation. If you have not been baptized or do not wish to receive Holy Communion, simply fold your arms across your chest, and the priest will know to give you a blessing instead. If you feel led to follow Christ in his call to be baptized, please see a member of the clergy immediately following this service to schedule your baptism.

The Church teaches that Christ is fully present in both the bread and the wine. Should you prefer not to receive the wine from the common cup, simply receive the bread and return to your seat. To receive the bread, hold out your hands with one on top of the other; or, you may receive directly on the tongue. To receive the chalice, guide the chalice to your lips while the communion minister continues to hold it. Alternatively, you may keep the bread in your hand, and the communion minister will dip it in the chalice and place it on your tongue.
